



Orangecrest Girls Softball Association 3-Strikes Policy



OCGSA 3-Strikes disciplinary policy establishes the range of discipline to be used in instances of Code of Conduct violations. This policy applies to both the general and player membership, but also to the parents, guardians, volunteers, spectators, and fans. The decision to hand down a “strike” will be determined by a disciplinary committee formed by the OCGSA President.

The individual that violates the policy will briefly meet (phone, in person, or virtually) with the appropriate board member(s) to review the infraction and to sign this document to acknowledge the infraction. Depending on the severity, a “strike” can be made permanent as determined by the Board. Otherwise, “strikes” reset each season.

Strike 1

In the event of a first violation of the Code of Conduct, a penalty to be imposed based upon the severity of the infraction, ranging from, but not limited to:

- Receiving a warning.
- Game(s) suspensions, which could include all other OCGSA activities during the period (practices and games).

Strike 2

In the event of a second violation of the Code of Conduct, a penalty to be imposed based upon the severity of the infraction, ranging from, but not limited to:

- Game(s) suspensions, which could include all other OCGSA activities during the period (practices and games).
- Revocation of membership for the remainder of the current season.

Strike 3

In the event of a third violation of the Code of Conduct, a penalty to be imposed based upon the severity of the infraction, ranging from, but not limited to:

- Permanent revocation of membership.

PLEASE NOTE: Based on ARTICLE II of the OCGSA Rules, other disciplinary actions may be taken in the event of “flagrant acts misconduct”. Also, as stated in the rules, any person suspended from OCGSA activities is not allowed to be present at any OCGSA event or function. This includes being in the dugout, the spectators’ areas, and the meadow.

Revocation of Membership, whether for the remainder of the season or permanent, requires a simply majority board vote. The person (or guardian in the case of a player) will have the opportunity to address the board before a vote is taken.

In the event the complaint is against one or more current board member, that member will not be allowed to observe or participate in the proceedings.
